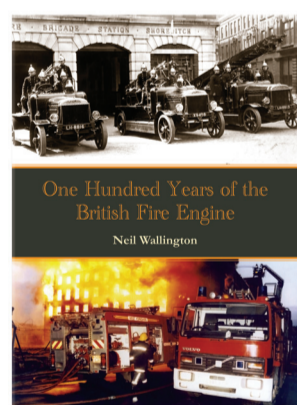

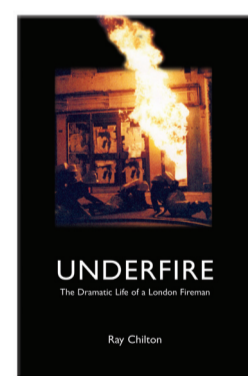

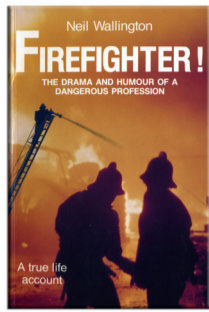

Chilton, as Soho Station Officer, builds and inspires a team, and guides his colleagues on a journey that involves bravery, conflict, grief and tragedy. As a result, *Underfire* is a fast-paced mix of dramatic action, impressive rescues and senseless tragedy; but Chilton also softens the grit with lighter moments, such as his fellow firefighters' inventive pranks and humorous anecdotes about some of his Watch's more bizarre call-outs.

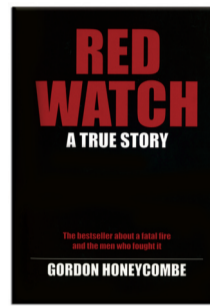
